A New International Cooperation

Maritime Security Centre, Horn of Africa (MSCHOA) run by EU established the International Recommended Transit Corridor (IRTC)

Multinational Naval assets deploy within the area to protect.

Somali Pirates : Increasing areas

In 2008, most of incidents were in the Gulf of Aden in 2008

In 2009, incident areas were expanding into the Indian Ocean
Some of these took place 1,000 nm far from Somali coast.

EU Nations extended naval operations as far as the Seychelles

Types of vessels attacked

In the case of Somali pirates; Bulk carriers: 109 Containers: 63 General cargo Chemical/product tanker Crude oil tanker Tug and Trawler Fishing boat

Low dry deck with full load, slow speed, small crew are vulnerable

by two JMSDF ships, escorted 193


The Forth Surface Escort Force will be taking over the mission
